The twelve accused lived in the area surrounding Pendle Hill in Lancashire, and were charged with the murders of ten people by the use of witchcraft. All but two were tried at Lancaster Assizes on 18 – 19 August 1612, along with the Samlesbury witches and others, in a series of trials that have become known as the Lancashire witch trials. One ...

The most famous of the Pendle witches actually died before coming to trial. Elizabeth Southernes (“ Old Demdike ”) had admitted to Nowell that she was a witch. In so doing she also implicated many of her co-accused, as did Anne Whittle (“ Old Chattox ”) who was herself accused of the murder by witchcraft of Robert Nutter.

Never forgetting the Pendle Witches ' tragedy | Lancashire ...

The Pendle witches. In August 1612 ten people were charged with witchcraft and sentenced to death. The key witness in the case was a nine year old girl, and three of the people executed as a result of her testimony were her own mother, sister and brother. The witch-hunting craze swept across Europe during the 17th century, with James I of England and VI of Scotland bringing the craze with him from the Danish court after his marriage to Anne of Denmark in 1589.

The twenty accused remained in jail at Lancaster, where it assumed that they eventually died. Much like Salem, Massachusetts, Pendle has become famous for its witchcraft trials, and has capitalized on that notoriety.
